

# **Corporate Challenge 2010**

## **SCORING & EVENT RULES**

Once all teams have completed an activity, event scores will be awarded according to placement. Scoring for all events will be determined by the number of teams plus 10; for example, if there are twenty teams, 1<sup>st</sup> place will receive 30 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> place 29, 3<sup>rd</sup> place 28, and 20<sup>th</sup> place 11 points. In the case of a tie, a tiebreaker will be used whenever possible. If the tie cannot be broken, the teams involved will equally divide the place points.

### **Corp Challenge Follies**

**Wednesday, July 21<sup>st</sup> @ 12 noon**

**Library – Brown Bag Concert**

This year teams will have a rare opportunity to show off their creative side! Only ten teams will be eligible, so call early to reserve your spot. These ten teams will create a 3 to 5 minute act to entertain and captivate the audience. The top 3 teams will receive prizes. However, all participating teams will earn 10 points toward their Corporate Challenge total score. Teams will need to arrive by 11:30 am and bring all your props.

### **Bowling**

**Sunday, Aug.15<sup>th</sup> @ 11:00am & 2:00pm**

**Flint Hills Lanes**

Teams will consist of 4 members, with at least one female participant.

The event will use the “9 pin no tap” format in which 9 pins knocked down will count as a strike. As a bonus, special prizes will be given if a “True Strike” is bowled (first ball only) when a colored pin is in the head pin position.

The event will consist of 3 games. Placing will be determined by the highest combination scratch total of all 4 bowlers for all 3 games. Prior to the start of the competition, there will be a 10-minute practice.

**Computer scoring is final.**

### **Pickleball**

**Monday, Aug. 16<sup>th</sup> @ 6:00pm**

**EHS Tennis Courts**

This will be a single elimination tournament with teams consisting of 2 members, with at least one female participant. Pickleball is a simple paddle game, played with a perforated slow-moving ball over tennis net, on a badminton size court. The ball is served underhand and points are scored by the serving side only. A game is won by the first side to reach eleven points. The first team to win two games shall be the winner.

### **Canoe Race**

**Tuesday, Aug. 17<sup>th</sup> @ 6:00pm**

**Hopkins Lake**

This will be a 3 person timed race, with at least one female participant. Details of this teamwork challenge will be explained at the event.

The canoes, oars, and life jackets will be provided

No alcoholic beverages will be permitted.

### **Kickball**

**Wednesday, Aug. 18<sup>th</sup> @ 6:00pm**

**Trusler & Whittier Ball Fields**

Teams will consist of 5 members, with at least one female participant. Three teams will play at one time and will rotate positions. One team will be up to bat; one team will be playing the infield positions: pitcher, 1<sup>st</sup> base, 2<sup>nd</sup> base, 3<sup>rd</sup> base and short stop, and the other team will be playing outfield and catcher positions. Teams will bat through their line-up twice before moving to play infield. Infield team will move to the outfield and outfield team will go up to bat.

Ball must be pitched underhanded with no back spin and must travel slowly allowing no bounce higher than 1 foot. The pitch must be released at or behind the 1<sup>st</sup> - 3<sup>rd</sup> base diagonal line and no fielder is allowed to cross this line until the ball is kicked. The catcher must remain behind home plate until the ball is kicked.

Batters will start with a “1 & 1” count. Foul balls will count as strikes. All kicks must occur on or behind home plate; failure to do so will result in an illegal kick and will count as a strike. A strike is called when a ball passes through the strike zone and is not kicked, the ball is missed by the kicker, or a foul ball is kicked. A ball is called when a pitch travels outside the strike zone, an illegal pitch is thrown, or a fielder advances beyond the 1<sup>st</sup>- 3<sup>rd</sup> base diagonal line.

Base runners must remain on the base until the ball is kicked. Runners must remain within the baseline when advancing from base to base; runners will be called out if struck by a ball below the shoulders while attempting to advance.

A player is considered out if they kick the ball over the outfield fence, receive 3 strikes, they are touched by a ball any time they are not on base, any ball kicked foul or fair caught in the air, or a runner leaves the base before the ball is kicked.

A base runner hit in the head by a thrown ball will be awarded home plate, along with all other base runners in front of them. If a runner intentionally uses their head to block the ball (umpire discretion) they will be called out.

Three innings will constitute a game.

### **Horse Shoes**

**Thursday, Aug. 19<sup>th</sup> @ 6:00pm**

**Peter Pan Park**

Teams will consist of two members, any combination of male / female.

Two teams play at one time, with one member of each team standing at opposite horse shoe pits. After a coin toss to determine the starting team, the first player tosses two horse shoes. The opposing team member standing on the same side then tosses their two. Whichever team scores the highest points each round determines the first player tossing on the opposite side. Each team member will receive 20 tosses, (10 total team rounds).

A ringer scores 3 points. A horse shoe landing within 6 inches of any part of the stake scores 1 point

### **Washers**

**Friday, Aug. 20<sup>th</sup> @ 6:00pm**

**Lyon County Fair Grounds**

This will be single elimination tournament with a two-member team, any combination, male or female.

Washers is a game of skill, in which individuals will compete against one another in an effort to be the first to reach a winning score of 25. There will be a 20-minute time limit for each game.

The game consists of two washer boxes located at a designated distance apart. Two teams play at one time, with one member of each team standing at opposite washer boxes. The object is to land the washers in the hole, or in the box, to score. After a coin toss, to determine the starting team, the first player tosses three washers. The opposing team member standing on the same side then tosses their three. Whichever team scores the highest points each round determines the first player tossing on the opposite washboard.

A washer inside the hole scores 3 points. A washer in the box scores 1 point. Washers on the ledge or not in the box are ineligible for scoring.

### **Bocce**

**Monday, Aug. 23<sup>rd</sup> @ 6:00pm**

**Peter Pan Ball Park**

This will be a single elimination tournament with a 4-member team, any combination, male or female. Two players from each team are stationed at opposite ends of the court and play alternate frames or innings.

The team winning the coin toss begins by tossing the pallino (target ball) anywhere they want in the playing area...then rolling or tossing one of the larger balls as close to the pallino as possible.

The starting team does not bowl again until the opposing team has succeeded in getting one of their balls closer to the pallino. The teams continue this way, with individual players alternating, until one side has used up all its balls, whereupon the other side is entitled to bowl its remaining balls. This ends a frame. Play switches to the

opposite side of the court with each frame.

One point is awarded for every ball that is closer to the pallino than the closest ball of the opposing team. The team, which wins a frame on points, starts play in the next frame.

**A game will be played to 20 points or a 20-minute time limit**

**Putt Putt**

**Tuesday, Aug. 24<sup>th</sup> @ 6:00pm**

**Emporia Family Fun Center**

Both 18-hole courses will be used for this 4-member team competition. Teams must have at least one female participant. Team members will all start at different holes with 4 teams playing together using a shotgun start. The team scoring the lowest will win the first place spot.

**In case of a tie, the winner will be determined by a playoff.**

**Darts**

**Wednesday, Aug. 25<sup>th</sup> @ 6:00pm**

**Club 707 (707 Commercial)**

This will be a “double” elimination tournament with a 2- member team, with at least one female participant.

Eight matches of “501” will be played at a time (16 teams). Soft tip darts will be provided or you may bring your own.

The game of “501” will be played, the best two out of three games. The first team to win two games shall be the winner. A limit of 10 rounds per game will be played.

Each player takes turns, throwing 3 darts in succession, constituting a turn

Dartboards will be electronic and will keep the scores.

**Bolo**

**Thursday, Aug. 26<sup>th</sup> @ 6:00pm**

**Peter Pan Ball Park**

This will be a single elimination tournament with a 2-member team, any combination, male or female.

Bolo is a game of skill and luck, in which individuals will compete against one another in an effort to be the first to reach a winning score of 30. There will be a 20 minute time limit for each game.

The game consists of two bolo standards located at a designated distance apart. Two teams play at one time, with one member of each team standing at opposite standards. The object is to wrap your “bolo” around one of the three horizontal poles, to score points. An under hand toss will be the only accepted delivery with only one golf ball of the bolo string being held in your hand.

A coin toss determines who will lead off, then players alternate throwing their bolos. This continues until each throws three bolos. Whichever team scores the most points in a round leads off on the opposite side for the next round.

In case of a tie, decide which player will lead off. The first player will throw 3 consecutive bolos and tally his score. The second player will then throw 3 consecutive bolos and tally his score. The player with the highest score breaks the TIE and wins that game.
